

MONITORING OF TEMPORARY INFLUXES

In addition to conducting bi-monthly Mobility Tracking interviews with key informants, the IOM DTM team monitors news and information from field staff and other IOM units regarding temporary influxes from Myanmar to Thailand. Influxes often occur during events of violence and confrontation between the national military and ethnic forces around villages near the border with Thailand. Local people seek safety in Thailand, sometimes staying in Temporary Safety Areas (TSAs) under the jurisdiction of the Royal Thai Government, until the security situation becomes more stable, at which point they are required to return to Myanmar.

DATE: The week of 14 JUNE 2023 - Ongoing LOCATIONS: Mae Sariang, Mueang

As of 20 December 2023, more than 2,600 people were staying in three TSAs in Mae Sariang and Mueang districts. An additional unknown number of people are staying in non-TSA locations in the area. Returns to Myanmar have increased during the reporting period. As of 20 December, nearly 8,700 people who were staying in TSAs have returned. (1)
