







'Front Line'



- Government organizations, NGOs receiving incident report through hotline, other channels
- Individuals, volunteers, community leaders.

Coming across or receiving incident report on following issues:

- Illegal or abnormal working condition
- Maltreatment over individuals
- Exploitation
- Other dysfunctional behaviors



Referring Information to 'First Responders' who are

- Authorized organizations by their jurisdiction over the incident report they receive (RTP, MOI, MOL, MSDHS, MFA, MOI, MoPH)
- The authorized officials by the law (officers under the specific ACT)



Screening based on the First Responder's mandate + identifying indicators for TIP/FL (using respective screening form)

Presumed Victims of **Trafficking in Persons**





Immigration Office (at provincial level) involves in case of providing a protection to migrants

Notifying the individual the rights of TIP/FL victims to prepare for an upcoming reflection period

Not having an indicator of TIP or FL

Refer to other related authorities





Providing four basic requisites





victim identification once s/he is ready. conducted by the respective MDT.**

** In case the MDTs cannot decide, they must refer the case to the experts at central level to decide.



Police officers whose jurisdiction covers the offence location will initiate a case file for investigation. They will receive information from the respective MDT.

Accommodations provided

- · Budget for overall location arrangement
- Security team arranged

- Authorities to taking care of individuals in accordance with Section 19, 20 and 58 of the Immigration Act.
- Immigration officers.

MSDHS/MOL arrange the officials to take care of these people based on individual's specific needs.

Person with legal status in Thailand

- There is no time limit for those voluntarily entering into a victim identification process.
- For a person who is not willing to access into criminal justice process, the authorities may apply Section 29 of the ATIP ACT
- The protection of children and women is based on specific level.

Four requisites




Medical treatment
