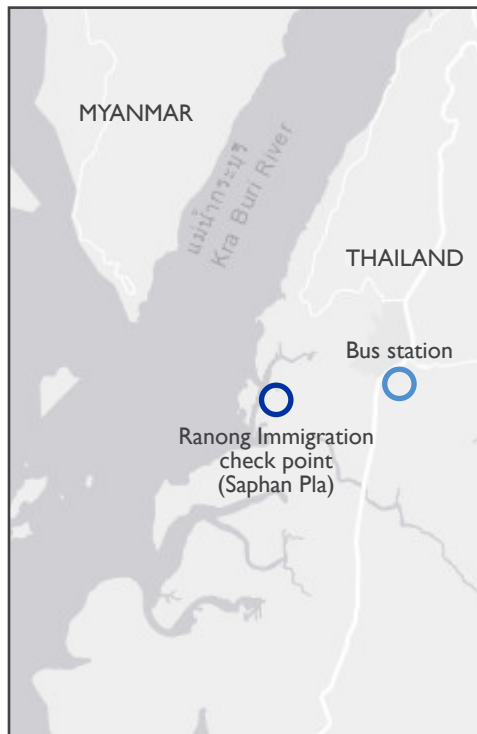

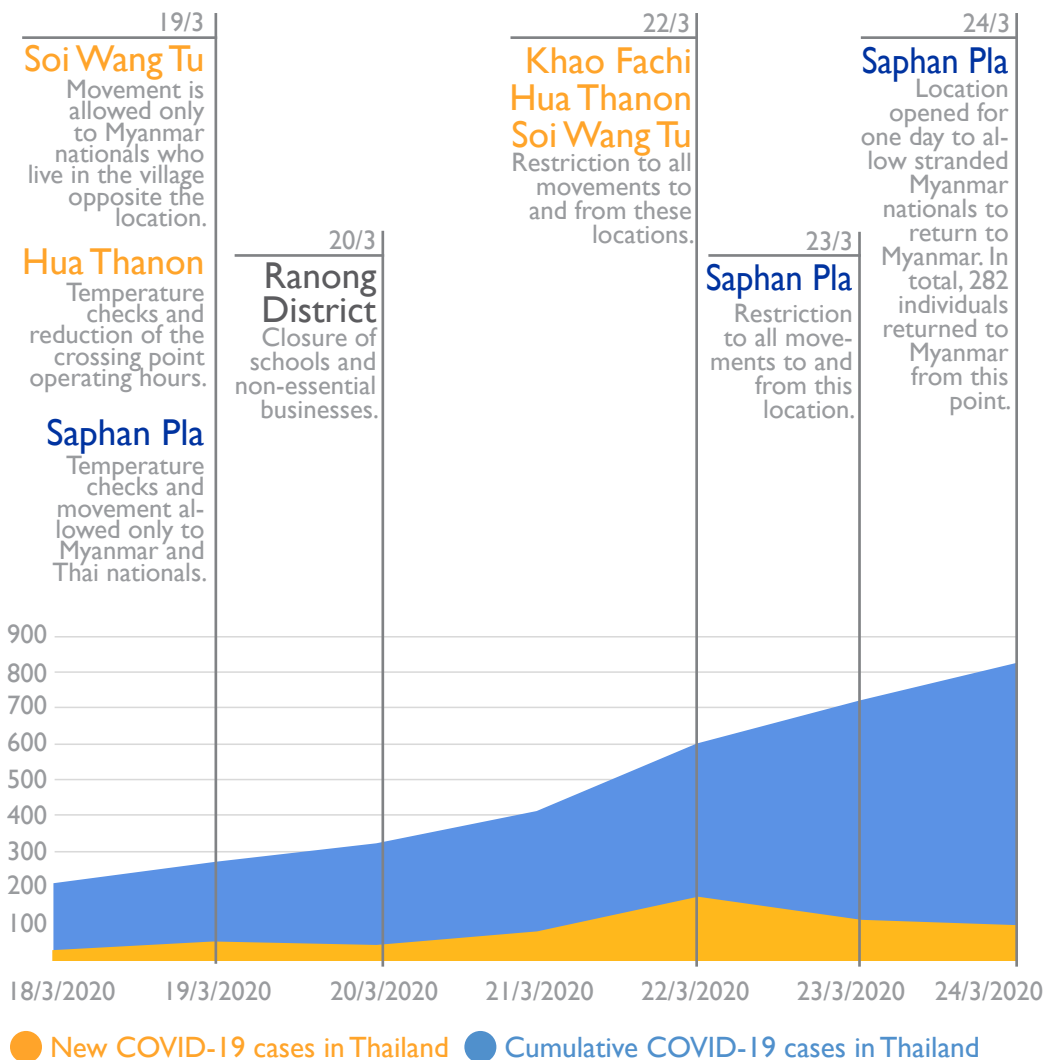
Locations in Ranong Mueang District

Soi Wang Tu
 Movement is allowed only to Myanmar nationals who live in the village opposite the location.

Hua Thanon
 Temperature checks and reduction of the crossing point operating hours.

Saphan Pla
 Temperature checks and movement allowed only to Myanmar and Thai nationals.

20/3
Ranong District
 Closure of schools and non-essential businesses.

22/3

Khao Fachi
Hua Thanon
Soi Wang Tu
 Restriction to all movements to and from these locations.

23/3
Saphan Pla
 Restriction to all movements to and from this location.

24/3

Saphan Pla
 Location opened for one day to allow stranded Myanmar nationals to return to Myanmar. In total, 282 individuals returned to Myanmar from this point.
